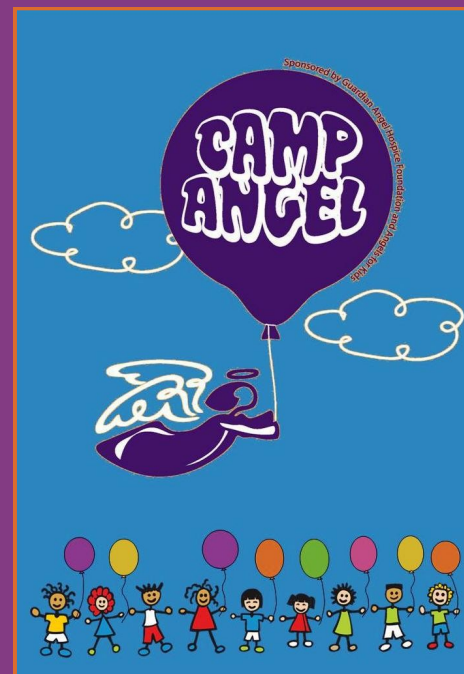

What is Camp Angel?

Camp Angel is a three-day camp that provides a meaningful, healing and enjoyable experience for grieving children and adolescents.

The camper may not realize that it is normal and natural to feel the way they do during the grief process. Camp Angel will allow the campers to meet other campers, like themselves, who are learning about and understanding their grief, and may have the same issues.

Camp Angel also allows the campers to run, play, laugh, to be themselves, and have a great time! — which is also normal in the grief process.

No matter what level of grief a camper is at, they are understood and accepted here.

Who staffs Camp Angel?

Camp Angel is staffed by volunteers from Guardian Angel Hospice and the local community. All volunteers are carefully screened by the leadership of Camp Angel and receive training prior to Camp Angel.

An introduction occurs before the camp so that campers and their parent(s) or guardian(s) are able to get acquainted with the volunteers who will be at Camp Angel. A Licensed Nurse will be at Camp Angel for the entirety of the weekend to assist with basic first aid and needs for all participants. Camp Tecumseh staff is also on hand to supervise campers for activities such as horseback riding and rock wall climbing.
